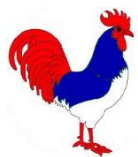
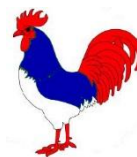

1. ANNOUNCEMENT

The Fédération Française des Sports de Glace and the Club Olympique de Courbevoie are pleased to announce the Rooster Cup 2011, an International Figure Skating Competition for Novices and Young Skaters (Girls and Boys).

- Advanced Novice Girls/Boys, born between 01.07.1995 and 30.06.2000
Short Program and Free Skating
- Basic Novice B Girls/Boys, born between 01.07.1995 and 30.06.1997
Free Skating
- Basic Novice A Girls/Boys, born between 01.07.1997 and 30.06.2000
Free Skating
- Cubs Girls/Boys, born between 01.07.2000 and 30.06.2002
Free Skating
- Chick Girls/Boys, born between 01.07.2002 and 30.06.2004
Free Skating

2. GENERAL REGULATIONS

The competition "**Rooster Cup**" will be conducted in accordance with the ISU Constitution and General Regulations 2010, the Special Regulations & Technical Rules Single and Pair Skating 2010 and ISU Communication n°1649, as well as pertinent ISU Communications.

All Members / Clubs which are members of National Figure Skating Federations associated with the ISU, are invited to take part in the competition.

The Advanced Novice Competitors must be entered through their respective Member Federation

Entries for the other categories may be accepted by Clubs which are members of National Figure Skating Federations associated with ISU

3. PLACE

Arena : "Patinoire Thierry Monier", Place Charles de Gaulle - 92400 Courbevoie
(an indoor ice-rink with the ice surface 56X26 m, air-conditioned and heated)

4. TECHNICAL DATA

4.1 Advanced Novices

Girls/Boys born between 01.07.1995 and 30.06.2000

Technical Rules - Novices ISU **communication n° 1649.**

Short Program : 2 min.30 sec. Max

Free Skating : Girls : 3 min (+/- 10 sec.)
Boys : 3 min 30 sec. (+/-10 sec.)

Short Program – Girls

- a) Axel Paulsen or double Axel Paulsen
- b) Double or triple jump immediately proceeded by connecting steps, may not repeat jump in a)
- c) One jump combination consisting of two double jumps or one double and one triple, both jumps may not repeat jump in a) or b)
- d) Layback or sideways leaning spin (minimum of six (6) revolutions)
- e) Spin combination with only one change of foot and at least one change of position (minimum of five(5) revolutions on each foot)
- f) One step sequence with full utilization of the ice surface (straight line, serpentine/circular)

Short Program – Boys

- g) Axel Paulsen or double Axel Paulsen
- h) Double or triple jump immediately proceeded by connecting steps, may not repeat jump in a)
- i) One jump combination consisting of two double jumps or one double and one triple, both jumps may not repeat jump in a) or b)
- j) Camel or sit spin (minimum of six (6) revolutions) with change of foot and no flying entrance
- k) Spin combination with only one change of foot and at least one change of position (minimum of five(5) revolutions on each foot)
- l) One step sequence with full utilization of the ice surface (straight line, serpentine/circular)

Girls and Boys

A well balanced Free Skating program must contain :

- a) Maximum of 6 jump elements for Girls and 7 jump elements for Boys, one of which must be an Axel type jump. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations or sequences. A Jump combination can contain only two (2) jumps. A jump sequence can contain any number of jumps, but only two most difficult jumps will be counted.
Only two (2) jumps with two and a half (2½) or more revolutions can be repeated either in a jump combination or in a jump sequence.
- b) There must be a maximum of two (2) spins of a different nature, one of which must be a spin combination (minimum of ten (10) revolutions in total), and one a flying spin or a spin with a flying entrance (minimum of six (6) revolutions in total).
- c) There must be a maximum of one (1) step sequence

Levels explanations:

For Advanced Novices, in all elements which are subject to Levels, only features up to **Level 3** will be counted. Any additional features will not count for Level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel

The Program Components are only judged in

- Skating Skills
- Transitions
- Performance/Execution
- Interpretation

The Factor of the Program Components is :

- a) Short Program
 - For Girls 1,0
 - For Boys 1,0
- b) Short Program
 - For Girls 1,5
 - For Boys 1,7

4.2 Novices B

Girls and Boys born between 01.07.1995 and 30.06.1997

Technical Rules - Novices ISU **communication n° 1649.**

Free Skating : Girls and Boys : 3 min (+/- 10 sec.)

Girls and Boys

A well balanced Free Skating program must contain :

- d) Maximum of 5 jump elements for Girls and 6 jump elements for Boys, one of which must be an Axel type jump. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations or sequences. A Jump combination can contain only two (2) jumps. A jump sequence can contain any number of jumps, but only two most difficult jumps will be counted.
Only two (2) jumps with two and a half (2½) or more revolutions can be repeated either in a jump combination or in a jump sequence.
- e) There must be a maximum of two (2) spins of a different nature, one of which must be a spin combination (minimum of ten (10) revolutions in total), and one a flying spin or a spin with a flying entrance (minimum of six (6) revolutions in total).
- f) There must be a maximum :
 - For Girls one (1) step sequence or one (1) spiral sequence consisting of maximum two (2) spiral positions. The sequence (step or spirals) will have a fixed Base value and evaluated in GOE only.
 - For Boys maximum of one (1) step sequence with a fixed Base value and evaluated in GOE only.

The Program Components are only judged in

- Skating Skills
- Performance/Execution
- Interpretation

The Factor of the Program Components is

- For Girls 1,7
- For Boys 2,0

Levels explanations:

For Basic Novice B, in all elements which are subject to Levels, only features up to **Level 2** will be counted. Any additional features will not count for Level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel

4.3 Basic Novices A

Girls and Boys born between 01.07.1997 and 30.06.2000

Technical Rules Novices ISU **communication n° 1649.**

Free Skating : Girls and Boys 2 min 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

Girls and Boys

A well balanced Free Skating program must contain :

- a) Maximum of 4 jump elements for Girls and Boys, one of which must be an Axel type jump. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations or sequences. Jump combinations can contain only two (2) jumps. A jump sequence can contain any number of jumps, but only two most difficult jumps will be counted.
Triple jumps are not permitted

- b) There must be a maximum of two (2) spins of a different nature (abbreviation), one of which must be a spin combination with or without change of foot (minimum of six (6) revolutions in total), and one spin with no change of position and with or without change of foot (minimum of six (6) revolutions in total).

- c) There must be a maximum :
 - For Girls one (1) step sequence or one (1) spiral sequence consisting of maximum two (2) spiral positions. The sequence (step or spirals) will have a fixed Base value and evaluated in GOE only.
 - For Boys maximum of one (1) step sequence with a fixed Base value and evaluated in GOE only.

The Program Components are only judged in

- Skating Skills
- Performance/Execution

The Factor of the Program Components is 2.5

Levels explanations:

For Basic Novice A, in all elements which are subject to Levels, only features up to **Level 2** will be counted. Any additional features will not count for Level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel

4.4 Cubs -10 Girls and Boys born between 01.07.2000 and 30.06.2002

and

4.5 Chicks - 8 Girls and Boys born between 01.07.2002 and 30.06.2004

Free Skating : Girls and Boys 2 min 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

Girls and Boys

A well balanced Free Skating program must contain :

- a) Maximum of 4 jump elements for Girls and Boys, one of which must be an Axel type jump. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations or sequences. Jump combinations can contain only two (2) jumps. A jump sequence can contain any number of jumps, but only two most difficult jumps will be counted.
Triple jumps are not permitted.
Only two (2) jumps with two (2) or more revolutions can be repeated either in a jump combination or in a jump sequence
- b) There must be a maximum of two (2) spins of a different nature (abbreviation), one of which must be a spin combination with or without change of foot (minimum of six (6) revolutions in total), and one spin with no change of position and with or without change of foot (minimum of six (6) revolutions in total).
- c) There must be a maximum :
 - For Girls one (1) step sequence or one (1) spiral sequence consisting of maximum two (2) spiral positions. The sequence (step or spirals) will have a fixed Base value and evaluated in GOE only.
 - For Boys maximum of one (1) step sequence with a fixed Base value and evaluated in GOE only.

The Program Components are only judged in

- Skating Skills
- Performance/Execution

The Factor of the Program Components is 2.5

Deduction : 0,5 by Fall

Levels explanations:

For Chicks and Cubs, in all elements which are subject to Levels, only features up to **Level 2** will be counted. Any additional features will not count for Level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel

5. ENTRIES

Entry Forms should be used

All Members / Clubs, which are members of National Figure Skating Federations associated with the ISU, are invited to take part in this competition. Each Club / Federation may enter **a maximum of 2 Competitors in Advanced Novice categories and a maximum of 3 in the other categories**, but in case of too many entries, the Organizing Committee reserves the right to limit the number of participants.

5.2 Entries of Judges

Each participating ISU Member may nominate **one (1)** ISU/International Judge.

If the number of entered Judges is too high, the Organizing Committee may reduce the number. The Concerned Members will be notified by electronic mail.

Each panel of Judges will consist of a maximum of 5 Judges, drawn among all nominated Judges.

The official Entry Form for Judges must reach the Organizing Committee (addresses mentioned above), not later than **Saturday, March 12, 2011**.

6. MEALS, LODGING AND TRAVEL EXPENSES

The "Club Olympique de Courbevoie" will provide and cover the expenses for rooms and meals for the Referees, the accepted Judges, the Technical Controllers, the Technical Specialists and the Data & Replay Operators, beginning with lunch on **Thursday, April 28, 2011** until breakfast **Monday, May 2, 2011**.

Travel fees will only be paid to the nominated Referees, the Technical Controllers, the Technical Specialists, and the Data & Replay Operators based on economy fare.

The organizer will not be able to cover any expense for competitors, team leaders and coaches.

8. PRACTICE

8.1 Official Practice

Official Practice for Competitors begins on **Thursday, April 28, 2011, morning**.
The details schedule will be issued at the time of registration.

8.2 Pre-Official Practice

Pre-Official Practices are available by special appointment at a cost of € (Euro) 15,00 per session (50 minutes) and per skater. Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday.

9. PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT

With the entry forms, the "Program Content Sheet" must be returned to the Organizing Committee in time. It is mandatory that the Program Content Sheet must be filled in precisely by each Skater in English using the terminology for the elements listed in the respective ISU Communication.

10. MUSIC

All competitors shall furnish competition music of excellent quality on CD (Compact Disk) format.

In accordance with Rule 343, paragraph1, all discs must show the Competition event, Competitor's name, the Nation and the exact running time of the music (not skating time) including any starting signal and must be submitted at the time of registration. Each program (short program, free skating) must be recorded on a separate disc. In addition competitors must provide a back-up drive for each program.

All music will be returned to the Skater at the end of the competition, in the "Kiss and Cry"

11. ACCREDITATION

The official accreditation is planned at **the ice rink** upon arrival

12. PRESENTATION OF MEDALS

The three best placed Skaters in each event will be announced and awarded with Trophies and Gifts. The others competitors will receive a medal. The national anthem of the winner will be played.

13. ANTI-DOPING CONTROLS

Anti-doping tests may be carried out in accordance with the current ISU Anti-Doping Rules & Procedures (ISU communications n° 1650 and 1651 or any further update of this communication) and the French Ministry.

14. INSURANCE / LIABILITY

In accordance with Rule 119, the Organizer assumes no responsibility for or liability with respect to bodily or personal injury or property damage incurred in connection incurred by Competitors or Officials. The Organizer will provide Medical Emergency Aid during the Competition.

15. OPENING DRAW

The opening draw will be automatic via a computer draw. The timetable will be available on www.cocpatinage.org

16. PARIS CITY TOUR

A free bus will be provided to visit Paris.
Early booking, on the site only, will be necessary.
Tickets can be retrieved at the accreditation.
