Checks dated after June 21, 2011 will not be accepted.

Entry fees shall be refunded only if the competition is not held or if the entry is withdrawn before the date of closing of entries (7000) (B) (1.5) (1) (2).

Music:

Audio cassettes will not be accepted. Each skater or couple will have to provide **two (2) compact disks CDR (and not CD-RW)** at the registration table at least one (1) hour before the beginning of his competition. There must be only one program by disc (on a single track) and it must be engraved in audio mode, mp3 will not be accepted. The name of the competitor, the category as well as the exact duration of the music must be indicated clearly. The discs must be

presented in their protective cases. **Clean your discs well** and ensure that they are not scratched in order to avoid any problem of reading. For all questions concerning music, write to info@studiounisons.com.

Program content :

The program content sheet must be given with your CD at your arrival at the competition site.

Video :

The orders will be taken directly on the site of the competition

Results:

The system "Code by Cumulating Points" will be used to determine the results for all categories. Posting of results will be done with the version produced by CCP : Publication of Results: Following each segment the Total Technical Score, the Program Component Score, the deductions and the Total Segment Score of every competitor must be published.

Awards:

Medals will be awarded to the top three placements in each event. In the case of only two entries, each entry shall be awarded a medal **(7000) (B) (1.13)**. No medal will be awarded for an exhibition even if it is evaluated.

Admission:

Entry \$ 10 / day \$ 30 / all events

At registration, **only** the competitor will receive a pass for the weekend. If the skater loses his pass, he will have to purchase one at the cost of \$ 15. In the dressing rooms, only pre-juvenile skaters will be authorized to have a person accompanying them, other than the coach.

A certified coach according to rules (must have the official photo I.D. card) will be admitted free.

TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS

The skaters must have successfully completed the test to register in the category of their choice with the exception of those who try centralized tests (see below for the criteria).

The skaters will have the possibility of registering in one segment if they wish to.

The skaters cannot register in two categories of the same discipline, example: registering both in pre-novice ladies free and novice ladies short will not be allowed.

For all categories, the skaters have to be eligible persons according to rules of section 5000 of Skate Canada.

NB. The programs are the official programs of competition including the changes accepted by Skate Canada after the meeting of the ISU which takes place in June. Please refer to the document « 2011-2012 Pre-event technical package » updates on Skate Canada's Web site at www.patinagecanada.ca.

CENTRALIZED TESTS

Please take note that it will be possible to try competitive tests during the Quebec Summer Championships.

Criteria:

- Register in the category in which the skater wants to be tested for;
- The skater can register in no other category of the same discipline (ex: register in the Juvenile ladies category and register in the Pre-novice ladies free for testing will not be permitted).

Pattern dances : Swing Dance

Free Dance : Please refer to the Juvenile Dance Well Balanced Program
Please note : Level of execution of the lift and spin will be no higher than level 1.

Duration : 2 minutes +/- 10 seconds skated to music.

PRE-JUVENILE (B)

Must have passed one dance of the Preliminary dance test.
