The Association Romande de Patinage (ARP), member of the Swiss Ice Skating Federation, is organizing **the 6th Trophée Romand**, an international Figure Skating Competition with the following events: Poussins, Avenir, Minimes, Minis, Espoirs, Advanced Novice, Junior, Seniors B and Senior in Single Skating.

- ISU Communication N° 1760 for Novices Competition

Max. 6 jumps, 1 Axel-type jump, max 2 combos or sequences, combos limited to 2 jumps, number of jumps in sequence is free, but only the 2 most difficult jumps will be counted, any double jump cannot be included more than twice in total as a solo jump or a part of a combinaison/sequence

Max 2 spins, spins must be of a different nature, 1 spin combination, with/without change of foot, 1 flying spin or spin with a flying entry

Max. one step sequence fully utilizing the ice surface

Special regulations:

-0,5 by fall , only features up to Level 3 will be counted

Poussins: (-9)

Free Skating:

Girls and boys born after 30.06.2005

Girls and Boys 2 min. 30 sec (+/- 10 sec)

Elements authorised:

Max. 5 jumps, max 2 combos or sequences, combos limited to 2 jumps, number of jumps in sequence is free, but only the 2 most difficult jumps will be counted, single axel or any double jump cannot be included more than twice in total as a solo jump or a part of a combinaison/sequence

Max 2 spins of a different nature, among USpB, SSpB, CSpB, LSpB, CoSpB, CCoSpB, CUSpB, CSSpB, CCSpB, 1 spin must be in one position

Girls: one step sequence with a spiral of 3 seconds and other movements

Boys: one step sequence fully utilizing the ice surface (spiral is optional)

Special regulations:

-0,5 by fall

Skating Skills, performance/execution

All ISU members and clubs, members of National Figure Skating Federations associated to ISU, are invited to take part in the competition.

In case of too many entries, the Organizing Committee reserves the right to limit the number of participants.

Entries must be done with the attached Entry Form.

4. Deadline for entries:

Your registration must include for each competitor last and first name, date of birth, club and country of affiliation, and competition category.

5. Entry fees:

Each competitor is requested to pay a 80.00 € or 100.00 CHF entry fee (Mini, Espoirs, Advanced Novice, Junior, Seniors B and Senior) or 50.00 € or 60.00 CHF (Minimes, Avenir, Poussins).

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A rebate will be awarded to foreign teams.

6. Expenses:

Travel expenses, accommodation and meals are at the charge of the participants.

7. Liability:

The organizer will provide Medical Emergency Aid during the competition.

In accordance with ISU Regulations, Rule 119, the organiser may not be held responsible for eventual accidents or other damages to participants, officials or third parties.

8. Music:

Music will be reproduced from a CD-player. CD's must be submitted at the time of registration. Each program (short program, free skating) must be recorded on a separate CD. In addition, competitors must have a backup CD ready for each program.

9. Calculation of results:

The marking system (ISU Judging System) as described in ISU Special Regulations and Technical Rules Single Skating , Rule 352, will be in place in all categories.

10. Awards:

The three best competitors of each event will be awarded with cups.
All other competitors will receive a gift.

11. Draws:

The opening draw will be done automatically via a computer draw. The timetable will be available on <http://www.patinageromand.ch/home.php> one week before the competition. The starting order for free skating will be in reverse order of the result of the short program.
