1. General Regulations

The competition will be conducted in accordance with the ISU General Regulations 2006 and Special Regulations Synchronized Skating 2006, as well as all pertinent ISU Communications.

2. Rules of Competition

The competition will consist of free skating only, performed two days in a row. The first day of competition the teams will be drawn in random order. The second day of competition the teams will be drawn in groups according to the list of placement from day one.

The marks from both days will be added to get the final result. Factor 1,0 will be used which means that the result from the two days will be equally important.

Official practice will only be held before the first day of competition.

3. Technical Data

The competition will take place at the Frölundaborg arena with an ice surface of 60 meters in length and 30 meters in width. Official practice will take place in the same ice rink. The rink is indoor, heated artificial ice rink.

Free Skating Duration: 3 minutes, 30 seconds, +/- 10 seconds,

4. Entries

In this Pre-Announcement the Organizing Committee is happy to invite a maximum of four (4) teams from each ISU Member to participated at the Leon Lurje Trophy.

However, in order not to exceed twenty four (24) teams in total, the Organizing Committee reserves the right to, if necessary, reduce the number of teams from each ISU Member. Final decision will be made by November 10th.
